CYBERCRIME Help Starts Here: Dial 211

Cybercrime and online fraud can happen to anyone; it's important to know where to turn if it happens to you.

That's why NJ 211 partnered with Cybercrime Support Network https://cybercrimesupport.org and https://fraudsupport.org.

Using the National Cybercrime Victim Resource Database, 211 makes sure that New Jersey residents have the resources they need while guiding them through the process of reporting, recovering, and reinforcing their security following a cybercrime.

What exactly is cybercrime?

Cybercrime is any activity that uses the internet to access, transmit, or manipulate data for illegal purposes. This includes the fraudulent representation of oneself for financial gain, personal gain, or with malicious intent.

Common types include:

- Identity theft
- Imposter scams
- · Hacked accounts and devices
- Financial and purchase scams
- Cyberbullying, harassment, and stalking

Rules you can follow to stay safe

 If an offer or opportunity seems too good to be true, it's probably a scam.

- Never wire money, send gift cards, or send a check to a stranger.
- If someone claims to be from a federal agency, call the office to confirm.
- Never accept money from a stranger promising you can keep some of it.
- If you suspect you've been hacked, change your passwords immediately.

Did you know every 2 seconds someone in the United States becomes a victim of cybercrime? If you're one of them, dial 211.



COVID-19 vaccines are on the way to hospitals and clinics across New Jersey. You can reserve your spot to get a vaccination now by pre-registering. COVID-19 vaccine registration is easy. Visit the New Jersey Department of Health COVID-19 Information Hub at (https://covid19.nj.gov/vaccine) to complete the COVID-19 vaccine registration form.

You'll be asked some questions to determine when you are eligible to receive a vaccination. Filling out this form should take a few minutes, and the information you enter will be kept private with the State of New Jersey.

As of January 14, 2021, the following groups are eligible for the COVID-19 Vaccine:

- Paid or unpaid persons working or volunteering in a healthcare setting
- **⊘** Residents of long-term care facilities
- **Output** Frontline first responders
- Persons aged 65 and older
- Persons aged 16 to 64 years' old who have at least one chronic medical condition that poses to be a high-risk;

Due to the constant changing circumstances of the pandemic New Jersey will be updating the list of groups eligible for the COVID-19 vaccine.
